BOIL WATER NOTICE

Boil Your Water Before Drinking or Food Preparation to Avoid Illness

The San Bernardino County Department of Public Works - Special Districts, Water and Sanitation Division (Division) shut-down water main pipelines for emergency repairs today, Wednesday, March 15, 2023. The State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water, the San Bernardino County Public Health Department, and the Division, as a precautionary measure, are advising all residents in CSA 70 CG to only use boiled tap water or bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes as a safety precaution to avoid stomach or intestinal illness.

The Division will inform you when water tests show that the water is safe to drink and you no longer need to boil your water. We anticipate notifying residents by Wednesday, March 22, 2023. If you have questions about other uses of tap water, such as bathing and dish-washing, please call the Division or read this guidance:

Optional: Bottled water is available upon request by calling (760) 955-9885.

Do not drink the water without boiling it first



- Boil all water for one (1) minute (rolling boil).
- Let water cool before drinking.
- Use boiled or bottled water for drinking, brushing teeth, and food preparation until further notice.
- Boiling water kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.

If you are unable to boil your water:

Household unscented liquid bleach



- For clear water, use 8 drops (1/8 tspn.) of bleach for 1 gallon of water. For cloudy water, filter through a clean cloth and use 16 drops (1/4 tspn.) of bleach for 1 gallon of water.
- Mix well. Allow to stand for 30 minutes before using.
- Water may taste or smell like chlorine. This means disinfection has occurred.
