METER UPDATE

- Meter permits issued in August = 1
- Available meter permits as of August = 131
- Active water availability letters as of August = 33
- Inactive meters in the District as of August = 25
- Total meters in the District as of August = 3,498

DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

1. The annual cycle of valve exercising, hydrant flushing, and dead-end flushing has commenced for 2026. Totals through August are as follows: valves exercised: 201; hydrants flushed: 140; dead ends flushed: 44.
2. Routine daily maintenance performed at all facilities during normal system checks and logging.
3. During the month of August, 57 service orders were closed that consisted of meter re-reads, status checks, disconnects, reconnects, meter leaks, meter repairs, and meter replacements.
4. There were 247 Underground Service Alerts (USA's) called in during the month of August.
5. There were 0 fire flows completed for District customers during the month of August.
6. There were 20 after-hours/emergency call outs during the month of August.

BADGER ORION REPLACEMENT PROJECT

New Badger ORION cellular units continue to be replaced through the manufacturer's warranty program. EyeOnWater is available to customers whose accounts have an active ORION cellular unit. Through the EyeOnWater website or mobile application, customers can review recent and historical water use, compare usage by day, week, month, or year, and identify changes in their normal consumption patterns.

Customers can also establish leak-alert thresholds and select email or text notifications for continuous or unusual water use. These alerts may help customers identify leaks earlier, reduce water waste, and avoid unexpectedly high consumption. To register, customers will need their water account number and the ZIP code for the service address. The EyeOnWater flyer and registration instructions are available on the CSA 70 J webpage.

WATER CONSERVATION

On March 24, 2023, the Governor signed Executive Order N-5-23 proclaiming the end of Stage 2 water restrictions. Therefore, on May 23, 2023, the Board of Supervisors approved to rescind Stage 2 – Drought Alert and adopt a new resolution declaring Stage 1 – Drought Watch for all CSAs in accordance with the Water Conservation Program Ordinance No. SD-15-04 and the Governor’s Executive Order N-5-23.

We ask that you continue to adhere to Executive Order B-37-16, “Making Conservation a California Way of Life” restrictions that prohibit wasteful practices such as:

- Hosing off sidewalks, driveways and other hardscapes;
- Washing automobiles with hoses not equipped with a shut-off nozzle;
- Using non-recirculated water in a fountain or other decorative water feature;
- Watering lawns in a manner that causes runoff, or within 48 hours after measurable precipitation; and
- Irrigating ornamental turf on public street medians

Please note that outdoor irrigation is limited to 4-days per week and the summer/winter watering times will remain in effect.
